Fearless! Hudson Valley, Inc. is thrilled to invite you and your 9-12th grade students to our 10th Annual "Love Shouldn't Hurt" Youth Summit on Thursday, March 20, 2025 at SUNY Orange.

Love Shouldn't Hurt is a transformative experience designed for youth and adult ally participants to gain knowledge and skills necessary to identifying and addressing teen dating violence in our communities.

What we know is that:

- 1 in 3 adolescents in the U.S. will experience abuse from a dating partner before they turn 18.
- Girls and young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence- almost triple the national average,
- 80% of guidance counselors say they feel unprepared to address incidents of abuse at their school.

During Love Shouldn't Hurt, students and chaperones will have the opportunity to participate in various workshops designed to educate around teen dating violence and other forms of gender-based violence. Additionally, participants will be provided practical tools and resources they can bring back to their school and community to support creating environments free from abuse, violence and oppression.

Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Each school will have the opportunity to bring up to 20 students and 2 adult chaperones, with potential for more depending on space availability. Lunch will be provided free of charge. Students must arrive between 8:15-8:45AM and will be dismissed at 1:15PM.
