

A MESSAGE FROM OUR **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR** Kellyann Kostyal-Larrier



At times it seems inconceivable that two years have passed since the beginning of this life altering pandemic, and 2021 continued to be an incredibly challenging year. Fearless! staff remained strong, resilient and unwavering. The demand for services continued to increase dramatically, and it has been challenging to keep pace with those needs. There were significant obstacles for everyone, and once again Fearless! saw an increase in need for programs and services. Hotline calls rose an additional 10% in 2021, and a staggering increase of almost 40% since 2019.

Despite these unprecedented times, our commitment to our mission, vision, and values continued to strengthen. Fearless! responded 24 hours a day, 365 days per year to victims, survivors, and the community's need of crisis assistance. We increased services including expanding our Risk Reduction Response and Trafficking Programs, and began providing sexual assault services in Sullivan County.

Dreams Become Reality

What started as a brainstorming session in 2012 to address the number of survivors and their children that were denied shelter because we were at capacity led us on a nine year journey. While COVID drastically slowed us down- it did not stop our commitment and progress. In November of 2021, we officially opened Shelter II. We had dreamt of a more official grand-opening and yet the very reason we had started down this road, compounded with the additional impacts of COVID on shelter space, had us quietly opening the doors, and within days all available beds were full. This project could not have happened without so many incredible heroes, like each of you, along the way.

The Power of Giving

In another year where our fundraising events were scaled back or canceled, the community continued to ensure that Fearless! had the support we needed to ensure programming and services were available to survivors. The generosity and spirit of Orange and Sullivan communities was incredible. We are truly grateful for your support. The need continues to be significant and your continued support will be life changing for survivors who have benefited from programs and services provided at Fearless!.

Not for the Faint Hearted

Ending gender based violence has no simple solution and the mechanics of the why are intricate, complicated, and reinforced by visible and invisible walls. While managing a pandemic gender based violence did not stop, in fact, there were no reductions. These truths played out nationally in countless communities across the country where victims were terrorized by someone claiming to love them, with high profile cases like the murder of Gabby Petito, and the continued criminalization of survivors like Nicole Addimando and Tracy McCarter. Nobel Peace Laureate Dr. Denis Mukwege once said "It is not just perpetrators of violence who are responsible for crimes, it is also those who chose to look the other way". There is no other option but to get involved with finding a solution because failing to do so has grave consequences for generations to come.

It is time that each one of us choose to be Fearless!.

FEARLESS is thankful to these five extraordinary and selfless humans, who have all made a significant impact within their communities. It's truly an honor to call them Fearless! Friends and to have honored them at our 35th Anniversary Celebration of Hope Gala, where we raised over \$35,000 to support victims and survivors.



Kim is a domestic violence survivor who served 17 years in prison for defending herself from her abuser. During the eleven years she's been home, Kim has spoken publicly to a wide variety of audiences about the intersection of trauma and women's incarceration at conferences, panels and forums. Kim was a featured Survivor at the Brooklyn Film Festival in the award-winning documentary, 'And So I Stayed.' Kim has conducted numerous interviews about her experiences and ideas for change, and has lobbied and testified in Albany for legislative changes for survivors in the criminal justice system. Kim has been a leading voice in the passage of the Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act. Kim's story and advocacy efforts have been featured in many prominent media sources and she was a leading member of the Coalition for Women Prisoners' Domestic Violence Survivors Justice Act's ten-year-long Campaign.



Terry's belief in and support of the work of Safe Homes/ Fearless! was inspired by his wife Jacqueline's work with Lisa Daily and David Goggins in founding this organization and nurturing its infancy and childhood. What amazing company to travel with! As Safe Homes grew and recently transformed to Fearless!, Terry has found ways to support its work by painting a mural at the original shelter, volunteering at events, supporting its move to the Newburgh YMCA, creating graphic work in support of its mission and ongoing work, teaching many of its staff in the Humanistic/ Multicultural education Graduate Program, helping organize fundraising events like the You Can Be Heroes 5K run/walk, and creating a second mural for the new Fearless! Shelter.

What would you tell someone considering volunteering at Fearless!?

"Domestic Violence affects 1 in 3 relationships. The work of Fearless! needs volunteers to help bring awareness to this issue. Together we can affect change and help end this cycle of violence. The Fearless! family will help you gain the language and advocacy skills to safely help survivors.

What is it like to be a volunteer at Fearless!?

Volunteering at Fearless! has brought me a sense of purpose, new skills, and an inspiring network of people. Not-for-profits are always short of funding and resources but the commitment of Fearless! staff to give above and beyond their job descriptions, inspires me to do more every day.

How are you involved at Fearless!?

Since volunteering at Fearless! I have helped with answering hotlines, supporting the shelter, and helping at various community events. The majority of my time has been focused on supporting victims in family court by providing emotional support and advocacy.

What inspired you to be involved at this level?

I developed a commitment to the mission of Fearless! after helping close friends and family members face abuse in their relationships. While researching agencies that could help these survivors I came across Fearless! and eventually joined the agency's efforts as a volunteer. All of the survivors I have met inspire me! As I have journeyed with them in their process of recognizing abuse and healing, I realized how much more was needed in terms of education, intervention, and resources, and continue to share the work of Fearless! anywhere I can.



In 2017, Fearless! was awarded a \$3.85 million HHAP Grant to build a new 20-bed facility for victims and their children. In 2019, Fearless! began construction, and it was completed in 2021. Our 2021 financial report reflects the remaining revenue. The remaining construction cost of \$202,128 is capitalized and not included in expenses.


