


2017 COMMUNITY IMPACT REPORT

- AT A GLANCE -

Confidential services, including shelter, to victims of intimate partner violence, teen dating violence, and human trafficking. Education, outreach, and prevention programs for adults and youth.



66 Adults and 45 Children accessed safety



5,322 Nights of Safety provided in our Shelter's inclusive environment.



741 Adults and 543 Children served through Non-Residential Programs in Orange County; 47 Adults and 45 Children served through Non-Residential Programs in Sullivan County.



18,383 Advocacy Services in Orange County and 214 Advocacy Services in Sullivan **County** encompassed the areas of court accompaniment, legal support, law enforcement, medical, mental health, social services, housing, immigration, employment, economic empowerment, and education.



3,166 Crisis Line Calls in Orange County and 54 Crisis Line Calls in Sullivan County provided safety planning and access to support services and resources.




7,326 Supportive Counseling Services in Orange County to individual victims and survivors, creating 5,099 individualized Safety Plans. 314 Supportive Counseling Services in Sullivan County to individual victims and survivors, creating 238 individualized Safety Plans.



8 Pets were sheltered through our partnership with the Warwick Valley Humane Society for a total of **578 nights** of safety.



162 Legal Cases for orders of protection, custody, divorce, visitation, and child and spousal support represented by Legal Services of the Hudson Valley, through the Family Justice Center.



92 cents of every dollar donated to Safe Homes goes directly into programs and services to help survivors and to educate our community.



119 referrals for our Therapeutic Counseling Program provided counseling to 133 individuals with an incredible 1,306 sessions being provided.



Safe Homes advocates co-located within Child Protective Services (CPS) in Goshen and Newburgh worked collaboratively with CPS on 549 cases involving indicators of domestic violence and reported child abuse. They provided services and information to 364 individuals, conducted 113 joint visits within the home and community.



The Domestic Violence Liaison (DVL) conducted 295 DV assessments for DSS assistance and provided 372 waivers to enable survivors to safely comply with DSS requirements. The DVL connected 145 individuals with Safe Homes for services and ongoing support.



Orange County Safe Harbor (a collaboration with the Orange County Department of Social Services, Safe Homes, and HONOR) received 134 referrals for youth and provided 120 youth with services, including safety planning, individual support, case management, and referrals to service.



Participating with the OC District Attorney's Office, Safe Homes assisted on 70 grand jury cases, advocacy for survivors on 515 occasions, and received 24 referrals for Safe Homes services.



131 Presentations reached 1,741 adults, raising awareness about the complex dynamics and impact of intimate partner violence and human trafficking.

264 Age-appropriate Presentations reached 4,561 Adolescents and Teens on topics including abusive versus healthy relationships, physical and online bullying, sexism, systems of oppression and cultural competency.



City of Newburgh and City of Port Jervis Police Officers identified 310 high risk cases in the City of Newburgh and 215 high risk cases in the City of Port Jervis through Safe Homes new Risk Reduction Response Program and immediately connected these individuals to the Safe Homes 24-hour hotline. The Project Coordinator for the City of Newburgh Police Department reviewed 686 domestic incident reports and conducted 187 joint home visits with law enforcement. The Project Coordinator for the City of Port Jervis Police Department reviewed 482 domestic incident reports and conducted 35 joint home visits with law enforcement.
